IMPORTANT RESOURCES

As summer sets in and temps start to soar, cool season grasses, like those used in lawns, can lose a bit of their leafy luster. For warm season grasses though, this is the time to shine. Warm season grasses are most productive when it is hot and dry, providing important resources, like seeds for birds, shelter for bees, and host plants for butterflies and moths. In fact, over 70 species of moths and butterflies depend on these grassy graminoids.
